Currently, he is working on enhancing the measurement of life satisfaction and solving issues related to measuring unobservable inequalities and accurately estimating time preferences.

Then earned a doctorate at Hiroshima University Graduate School, conducting research on RAS signal transduction. For eight years, worked as a postdoctoral researcher at the University of Michigan, focusing on genes related to colorectal cancer. After returning to Japan in 2006,

continued my research on colorectal cancer and hereditary tumor syndromes while practicing as a surgeon. In 2019, appointed professor of genetic medicine at the Department of Genetic Medicine at Hiroshima University Hospital, dedicating to promote and enhance the education of genetic medicine

Additionally, advancing research on educational support for students with mental health issues who face challenges in adaptation, psychological aspects, and behavior, as well as support for students requiring medical care.
