Abstract of the Lecture

This year is the 80th anniversary of the end of the Second World War and Hiroshima's tragic experience. Despite the development of humanitarian norms, non-State and international armed conflicts continue to deprive people of their lives, destroy cities and villages, and traumatize communities. In this lecture, we trace Hiroshima's post-Second World War reconstruction process from the perspective of local peacebuilding. Key to Hiroshima's peacebuilding process was the 1949 *Hiroshima Peace Memorial City Construction Law*, which not only provided the financial means for reconstruction but also helped shape Hiroshima's identity as a peace memorial city. This example shows a law's role in peacebuilding and the importance of setting a shared vision in reconstructing a conflict-affected society.
