Commonly employed in ...

- **Wholesale/Retail:** Approx. **18%** of the former students
- **Manufacturing:** **15%**
- **Academic research/Professional & technical services:** **8%**
- **Information/Communications:** **7%**
- **Lodging/Restaurant service:** **6%**

3. Why Japanese companies hire international talent?

- ① To recruit excellent human resources regardless of nationality.
- ② To carry out assignments related to clients overseas.
- ③ To hire foreign nationals who can work as executive candidates for overseas subsidiaries.
- ④ To perform duties arising from newly launched businesses overseas.

Japanese companies have high expectations of international talents who can work globally with their specialties and language ability.

5. Common Questions in the Job Interviews

Why do you want to work in Japan?

- You may explain the reasons why you want to work in Japan, your motivations or how much you would like to contribute to the company/Japanese society.

How long do you like to work in Japan?

- Make sure to find out whether the job you are applying for requires you to work in Japan for a long period of time before joining the interview.

What benefits would you like to bring to the company?

- You should answer based on your own skills, as well as the internationality and language skills that are the strengths as an international student.

What are you most keen on doing as a student?

- You can answer about the university club activities, hobbies, etc.
You may state that you worked hard at both your studies and your part-time job.



6. How to be Successful to Join Your Preferred Japanese Companies

Japanese language proficiency is QUITE Plus!

Many companies prefer international talents with fluency of Japanese.

Below skills are most advantageous in your job search in Japan.

- (1) Japanese language (speaking/writing/reading)
- (2) Understanding of the Japanese culture
- (3) Specialty (especially for students in science major)

It is vital to be able to speak, read and write in Japanese to go through the job-hunting successfully.

It is recommended to attend Japanese courses as often as you can 😊
