Important notes on visiting a monument/facility

- ① Basically students are supposed to visit a monument/facility without accompanied by teachers. So, please ensure your own safety to avoid accidents.
- ② During the visit (including transportation), <u>please take basic measures to stop the spread</u> of infection such as sanitizing hands and washing hands.
- 3 As some facilities may be <u>limiting the number of visitors or require pre-booking</u>, please check the detailed information in advance.
- ④ In principle, walk or use public transportation for the visit. If you have no choice but to use a vehicle (including a bicycle), please be aware of the followings,
 - · Be aware that when incidents or accidents occur, it will be under your responsibility as a member of transportation society.
 - Pay close attention to following the traffic rules and preventing accidents. This also applies to passengers.
 - It is recommended that students take out insurance to protect themselves in case of an accident, such as voluntary insurance or comprehensive student life insurance.
- 5 In case of an incident or accident, <u>confirm the contact information and places of the nearest</u> medical facilities and police station in advance.
- In case of an incident and accident, make your own safety as a priority and be sure to contact the office below.
- 6 Since the visit will be conducted as a part of our regular curriculum, it will be covered by the Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS). In case that you get injured during the visit and to-and-from the visit, contact the student support office of your school and take necessary procedures. Please note, however, that the injuries during shopping, dropping and other cases out of rational way and means may not be covered by the PAS. In addition, if you give some damage to monuments, exhibits and others' property during the visit, you will be liable for the damage. In this case, the Liability Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (LSR) will compensate for it. However, Hiroshima University does not take part in the LSR collectively. Therefore, please pay close attention to exhibits. For further information about the PAS and the LSR, please read "student-life handbook" or see the Momiji website.
