(1) What you learn from participating START Program. How do you want to make the most of this experience in the future?

My main goals during my study abroad were to understand the energy situation in Egypt, to understand Islamic culture, and to improve my English skills through communication with local students. E-JUST, a university I visited during my study abroad, had large solar panels installed, and the university campus also had a simple roof to prevent the heat island effect and the ground from storing heat. In the lecture, students learned about global warming and energy conservation from an architectural perspective and learned that the amount of electricity needed to maintain proper temperatures can vary greatly depending on which part of a room is designed to allow wind to pass through. We also learned that most of the country is desert, with high room for solar power, and that the goal is to export power to Greece and other European countries across the Mediterranean Sea. Regarding Islamic culture, I saw firsthand how different it is from Japan, as most women wear a scarf and there are mosques and places to pray everywhere. I thought it would be good if Japan would set up places for prayer and provide halal food so that Muslims can spend their time comfortably. When I asked my local friend if it was difficult for him to pray five times a day, he said that he felt rather at ease because it is part of his daily life. I felt that we were able to accept cultural and religious differences and respect each other.

As for English proficiency, a foreign professor from Hiroshima University accompanied us as a guide, and we were able to actively communicate in English during the trip. At the universities I visited, I had many opportunities to interact with students who were studying Japanese, and we were able to teach each other Japanese and Arabic using English. The desire to talk more with local students and get to know them better motivated me to learn English. This experience sparked my interest in Arabic and global south, so I will apply for soma program which is related to that theme.

(2) What you thoughts on this program

I researched and presented basic information about the energy situation in Egypt, such as the country's dependence on fossil fuels, its ongoing shift to renewable energy, and its very high potential for solar and wind power generation, during my pre-study abroad training. I was surprised that I was not allowed to use electricity at E-JUST dorm from 7:00 to 8:00 pm every day. It is because a marked increased of electricity demand during summer seasons and Egyptian government decided to implement scheduled power outages. I thought that Egypt has a huge potential to produce more energy by utilizing solar and wind power but after final presentation, I was advised to think more critically about that so I will continue to research about this fields.

What was the most interesting was interaction with Egyptian students because we have both common and difference. It was really meaningful me to know the custom of Egypt and Muslim. I strongly believe that we can achieve any global issues cooperating and make a partnership all over the world and I want to contribute to make the sustainable society.

(3) Advice for students who are interested in this program

I'm so glad to participate this valuable program and strongly recommend other students to join this program. You can improve your English skills, discussion, presentation skills, understand and accept different culture through this curse. Some students may say that it would be hard for them to join e-start course because these classes are conducted in all English, but you have enough time to hone your academic skills for next e-start classes and Hiroshima university has a wide range of support for students who are keen to interact with English. However, I regrated that I didn't know much about Japan and bring many souvenirs, so please be well prepared about that.

(1) What you learn from participating START Program. How do you want to make the most of this experience in the future?

(3) Advice for students who are interested in this program

Although communication in English can be a challenge for us, so it is important not to be concerned about speaking perfect English, but try to speak something words anyway. However, the program will be even better if you improve your English and learn more about the countries (such as languages, culture or something) you will visit. In fact, there were many times when I did not understand the lectures correctly, and I regretted that I should have acquired more English skills and knowledge about the country. Also, in terms of health standpoint, bring enough medical supplies, especially more medicine for stomachaches and diarrhea, because we often had stomachaches and diarrhea. Egypt is a very different culture and value from Japan, so we learned a lot things we cannot learn in Japan. And, Egypt is also an attractive country because the people are kind, the food is delicious, and the cost of living is very low. Actually, I had a lot of fears before I went there, but most of the time it's ok, so don't worry too much.
