9 Outline of the course

This course is open to students in four countries: Japan, Egypt, Zambia, and Malawi. Through lectures, students will learn about fundamentals of international cooperation, various approaches for solving problems, and specific initiatives. Then, through group works, students will analyze issues and make proposals for international cooperation, and make a group presentation.

10 Detailed plan of the course

(1) Plan of specialized lecture

Period : From Feb 6 to Feb 19, 2025

Details :

After the orientation, lectures will be given in the fields such as education, health sciences, peace-building /conflict resolution and so on. Lecturers are invited from inside and outside Hiroshima University, who have been involved in international cooperation in Africa and other areas. Six lectures are scheduled including orientation.

(1) Academic Achievement and School Dropout in Africa (Kyoko Taniguchi)

(2) Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) in Developing Countries (Chiaki Miwa)

(3) Mathematics Education in Africa (Takuya Baba)

(4) Science Education in Africa (Kinya Shimizu)

(5) Maternal Child Health in Tanzania (Yoko Shimpuku)

(6) Conflict Resolution in Africa (Tatsuro Yamane)

(2) Plan of group work

Period: From Feb 20 to Feb 28, 2025

Details :

Students will be divided into several groups (Approx. 6 students per group) for group work. After six lectures, each group with a facilitator decides on a theme (e.g., roles of various actors in international cooperation, limitations and possibilities of international cooperation, etc.), discusses the theme, and prepares presentation materials on PPT. In the second half, each group will rehearse their presentation based on the draft presentation materials, and receive advice and comments from the lecturer and other groups. Afterwards, they will revise their presentation materials for the final presentation.

(3) Plan of final group presentation

Period : From March 3 to March 4, 2025

Details :

Each group will make a final presentation in about 30 minutes including Q&A. After the presentation,

participants will receive advice and comments from the lecturer and other participants, and exchange opinions.
