Recommended background knowledge

Basic knowledge of the 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): i.e. what they are, how and by whom they are promoted, what are the goals and targets etc.

① コース概要/ Outline of the course

This course aims to provide students with an opportunity to review and discuss what is peace for them and for their country by orienting them to the SDGs, the peace studies, the atomic-bombing experiences in Hiroshima, conflicts and peacebuilding in African/Asian countries etc. Among the 17 goals of SDGs, SDG-16 is the only goal that directly targets "promotion of peaceful and inclusive societies." Additionally, it should be noted that the other goals related to poverty, health, education, gender, inequalities, climate action etc. cannot be achieved without promoting peaceful societies. It is also true that there are trade-off inter-relationships among the SDG goals, which might create serious problems for achieving SDG-16. Students are required to work in a multidisciplinary and multicultural group in order to present a case associated with the possible trade-off inter-relationship between SDG-16 and the other SDG goals and the solution/intervention that would contribute to the promotion of the peaceful and inclusive societies through sustainable development.

(1) Detailed plan of the course

Lectures will follow the orientation. Seven lectures are planned, including orientation and briefing and planning of group work.

(2) グループワーク Plan of group work

Period: From Aug 22 to Aug 28, 2024

全参加学生を数グループ (6-8名程度) に分け、グループワークを行う。各グループにはファシリテーターがつく。これまでの講義を踏まえて、グループ毎に決定したテーマについて議論を重ね、PPTで発表資料を作成する。後半には、各グループが発表資料案を基に、発表リハーサルを行い、講師、他グループから助言、コメントを受ける。その後、最終報告会に向け、発表資料を修正する。

Students will be divided into several groups (approx.6 to 8students per each group) for group work. A facilitator will be assigned to each group. Based on the lectures, each group will discuss a selected theme and prepare presentation materials in PPT. In the second half, each group will rehearse their presentation based on the draft presentation materials, and receive advice and comments from the lecturer and other groups. Afterwards, they will revise their presentation materials for the final presentation.
