| How many years and local credits does it take to obtain a bachelor's degree at your institution? | <p>A minimum study of 7 semesters and not more than 16 semesters, with a total of 124 credits and an average GPA of 2.00, are required to be eligible for a Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics.</p> <p>For a Bachelor of Economics degree, a minimum study of 7 semesters and not more than 16 semesters, with option 1: single major with a total of 135 credits and option 2: major-minor with a total of 147 credits, and an average GPA of 2.00.</p> | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | |
| How many years and local credits does it take to obtain a master's degree at your institution? | A minimum study of 3 trimesters and not more than 6 trimesters (except Master of Arts in Business and Managerial Economics; full-time: minimum study of 3 trimesters, maximum 6 trimesters and part-time: minimum 6 trimesters, maximum 12 trimesters), with a total of 36 credits (option 1: 8 core courses and thesis and option 2: 8 core courses, 4 elective courses, comprehensive exam), and an average GPA of 3.00 are required to be eligible for a Master of Arts degree. | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | | |

| Thai language course | Students may take language courses on a fee-paying basis in one of the numerous language schools in Bangkok. |
| Accommodation | We assist students in arranging accommodation. Subject to availability, exchange students may stay at university residences or serviced apartments nearby. The monthly rent for university residences (CU iHouse) is 14,000-25,000 THB. Please find more details at https://www.chula.ac.th/en/academics/life-at-cu/accommodation/ . Note that landlords typically ask for a deposit to cover any damages or rent that's owed. This deposit has to be made on the day students move in and the usual deposit amount ranges from 1 month's rent to 3 month's rent. Note further that the rent is typically paid monthly and that students would pay in advance for the month. |
| Visa | Students must apply for a non-immigrant visa (category ED) at a Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate in their home country before entering Thailand. We do not provide supporting documents for visa conversions (e.g. converting a |

| Is arrival pick-up service provided to exchange students? If yes, how do they apply? | We do not provide an arrival pick-up service. Students can get a taxi or take the airport rail link to go the city center. |
| Health insurance | All students are required to purchase adequate health and liability insurance prior to their departure. |
| Living expenses | A student will need approximately THB 30,000 per month (3 meals per day, transportation costs and personal expenses), including accommodation and luxury items. |
| Tuition fee for visiting students | Visiting students have to pay tuition fees within the first two weeks of enrollment. Tuition fees consist of the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. university fee THB 11,5002. faculty fee THB 28,500 plus<ol style="list-style-type: none">2.1 first two courses THB 2,5002.2 three courses or more THB 14,250/course. |
